The driver and a second passenger, Fred Taylor, both sergeants in the service, were not hurt. Damage to the car was estimated at \$300 by the investigating officer, Patrolman R. P. Narron.

The three sergeants were traveling north on Highway 17 until they reached Williamston. Instead of making a right turn to follow 17 they continued straight and followed 125 to Hamilton where they continued straight to move on toward Palmyra. They realized they were lost and the driver lost control of the car when he reached for a road map.

Youthful Robbers Taken In County

The boys, Charlie Phillips, Jr., 16, Johnie Smith, 17, and England Andrews, 16, were given a hearing before Justice of the Peace R. T. Johnson and bound over to the higher courts. Bonds were required in the sum of \$200. Phillips and Smith arranged bond immediately.

Breaking through a front window, the boys allegedly carried away cigars, cigarettes, candies, crackers, headache powders, razor blades, water glasses and a number of bottle drinks, and some money from a piccolo machine. Most of the stolen goods were recovered in the Smith boy's room where he was sleeping with the Andrews boys.

They admitted the goods came from the Star Light place, but at the hearing pleaded not guilty.
