SOMETHING HOT SOMETHING COLD

Supper on the porch on a summer evening is as refreshing as a cool swim. Colorful fresh vegetables and sun-ripened fruits need only a few special dishes to round out delightful easy-to-prepare meals. To avoid becoming involved in a flurry of preparations on hot lazy days plan simple menus which require refrigerator rather than range preparation whenever possible.

Win a vote of approval from your family and friends with some of these hot weather specialties.

Tomato Juice Cocktail

3 cups (or 4 large tomatoes), 1-2 bay leaf, 1 tsp. salt, 1-8 tsp. pepper, 2 cloves, 1 t. chopped onion, 1 tsp. sugar, 1 cup water. Combine all ingredients and simmer in covered saucepan for one hour. Strain and cool. Place in refrigerator to chill.

Molded Salmon Salad

1 tablespoon gelatin, 1-4 cup cold water, 1 cup mayonnaise or salad dressing, 1 cup flaked red salmon, 3-4 cup chopped celery, 1-4 cup chopped green pepper, 1 tablespoon chopped parsley, 1-4 teaspoon salt, 1-8 teaspoon paprika, 1 tablespoon lemon juice. 1. Soak gelatin in cold water 5 minutes. Dissolve over hot water, and add to mayonnaise. 2. Add

remaining ingredients. Turn into ring mold which has been rinsed in cold water. (This fills a ring mold 6 1-2 inches in diameter, 2 1-2 inches deep.) 3. Chill in refrigerator until firm. 4. Unmold on bed of lettuce. Fill center of ring with tomato segments; surround with cucumber slices. Garnish with radish roses or olives. (6 servings).

Marbled Lettuce

1 head lettuce, 1 pkg. Philadelphia cream cheese, 2 tbsp. grated carrots, 1-8 tsp. minced green pepper, 1-6 tsp. Worcestershire sauce, 2 tsp. diced tomatoes 1 tsp. minced onion, 1-4 tsp. salt, 1-8 tsp. pepper. Remove center of lettuce and press in filling. Wrap in damp cloth and chill in refrigerator until ready to serve. Cut head of lettuce in fourths.

Refrigerator Fruit Roll

1 cup Graham crackers (rolled), 1 pkg. cream cheese, 1 cup pineapple (drained), 1-2 cup cherries, 1-4 lb. marshmallows, cream to mix. Mix all other ingredients

Tomato Biscuits
2 cups flour, 1 tsp. salt, 4 tsp. baking powder, 1-4 cup shortening, 7-8 cup strained tomatoes (2 lbs. less than 1 cup). Sift the flour, measure it and add the salt and baking powder. Cut in shortening with a dough blender or finger tips until well blended. Add tomato juice. Place on a slightly floured board and roll to about 1-2 inch thickness. Cut into biscuits and bake in 475 degree oven 10-12 minutes.

Jiffy Cheese Biscuits
2 cups flour, 3 tsp. baking powder, 1-2 tsp. soda, 1 tsp. salt, 1-4 cup shortening, 1-2 cup grated cheese, 1 cup buttermilk to make a soft dough. Drop by spoonfuls on greased pan. Bake at 475 degrees about 12 to 15 minutes.
