Local Firm Will **Handle Jet Curers**

The Farmers Supply Co. of Employment Office. Fresh vege- Williamston has been appointed AMF Jet Tobacco Curer, which uses the new principle of jet combustion to cure tobacco automatically and economically.

In contrast to curers familiar to tobacco growers, the AMF Jet Tobacco Curer requires no exhaust flues in the barn, because it produces virtually no smoke or soot or other ordinary products of oil combustion. Engineers of the American Machine and Foundary Company, who spent three years developing the unit, have found that from 98 to 99 percent of all the heat value in the oil is extracted.

Throughout the test period, which is now entering its fourth year, the AMF Jet Curer has been used by practical tobacco growers throughout the flue-cured belt. Farmers have reported fuel savings of from 30 to 50 percent or more, with "average" barns requiring from 75 to 100 gallons of No. 2 fuel oil, somewhat less expensive than the kerosene in com-
