Bidders who submit a bona fide and reasonably bid will be refunded the full amount of the deposit upon return of same in good condition within five (5) days after letting date. Cost of printing and handling will be retained on all others.

All Contractors are hereby notified that any and all pertinent provisions of the General Statutes of North Carolina governing the letting of public building contracts, subsequent amendments and enactments pertaining to the licensing, registration and regulation of their respective professions and trades will be observed in the receipt of bids and the award of the work. All bidders must be duly licensed as Contractors by the State of North Carolina at the time of submitting their bid and as provided by G. S. 195-54, Sub-section B, before undertaking to execute any contract.

A bidders' certified check for 5% of the bid must accompany each bid. (In lieu thereof a bidder may offer a certified check for 2% of the bid plus a bid bond of 3% of the bid.) As required by law, all certified checks submitted with proposals shall be drawn on a Bank or Trust Company insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. Said deposit to be retained by the Owner as liquidated damages in event of a failure of the successful bidder to execute the Contract within ten days after the award or to give satisfactory surety as required by law.

A performance bond is required

in an amount equal to 100% of the contract price conditioned upon the faithful performance of the contract and upon the payment of all persons supplying labor and furnishing materials for construction of the project.

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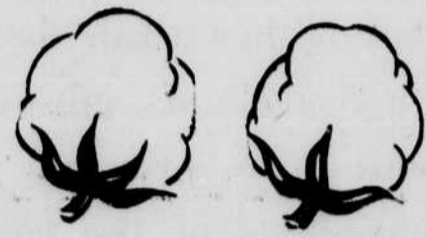
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6 STEPS TO EFFICIENT COTTON PRODUCTION



Don't Share Crop

with the

BOLL WEEVIL!

IF YOU GROW COTTON IN 1950, PLAN NOW to CONTROL INSECTS

Survival counts indicate a record number of weevils in hibernation. The boll weevil can be stopped—

1949 Results:

- 15 fields on which recommendations were followed produced 513 pounds of lint.
- 15 adjoining field on which no control practices were followed produced 177 pounds of lint.
- Experimental tests with insecticides, where a complete control program followed, show increases of 104 to 138 percent (1-2 to 3-4 of a bale per acre). Total cost of the insecticides used in these tests amounted to about \$10 to \$15 for the season.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE CONTROL OF COTTON INSECTS

Insects	Insecticides	APPLICATION
1. Boll Weevil	3% gamma BHC*·5% DDT or 20% Toxaphene or 10% Chlordane, 5% DDT**	Where weevils are a problem each year make 3 applications, 6-8 lb. per acre, at 5-7 day intervals starting when squaring begins; watch conditions and if infestation rises to 10% make 2 or 3 additional applications using 10-15 lb. per acre at 5 day intervals.
2. Aphid (Plant louse)	3% gamma BHC·5% DDT	10 lb. per acre, at 5 day intervals, for heavy infestation. Usually one application will bring pests under control. May need to be applied very early. Treatment for boll weevil should hold population in check.
3. Thrips, Fleahopper, and Plant Bugs	3% gamma BHC·5% DDT or 20% Toxaphene or 5% DDT	10 lb. per acre, as necessary (control usually achieved when dusting for other insects.) Same as above
4. Bollworm	3% gamma BHC·5% DDT or 20% Toxaphene	8-10 lb. per acre, at 5 day intervals, when 4-5 worms found per 100 terminals. Same as above.
5. Red Spider	Sulphur	20 lb. per acre in case of outbreak (control usually achieved where sulphur is included with BHC, Toxaphene or Chlordane.)
6. Leafworm	3% gamma BHC·5% DDT or 20% Toxaphene	10 lb. per acre, as necessary (control usually achieved when dusting for other insects.) Same as above

*Technical grade benzene hexachloride containing 3% of the gamma isomer.
**Experimental results have been variable. In some areas results have been quite effective.
