

47,000 Boys Were At Valley Forge For Great Event

obtained at central commissaries. Each campsite, and there were over one thousand, had a separate entrance. Many had exhibits. Troop seven, containing all the Martin County boys, had models of the Wright Memorial and the Wright airplane on display. The

models of each of these historical pieces were quite realistic and caused much comment. The troop put on a miniature "Lost Colony" pageant one night at a small campfire meeting. The slaughter of the colonists by the Indians was almost too realistic. Many of the boys had bruises the next morning.

A boy is a born trader, and at a meeting such as the Jamboree, he gratifies his every impulse. Martin County carried tobacco. To a boy from New York, two leaves of tobacco equals one pocket knife. Boys from Nebraska brought cockle-burrs and traded them as porcupine eggs, giving, free, explicit instructions on how to hatch them!

Confederate flags were taboo, but that merely served to multiply them. Before the Jamboree was over, they were flying from GHQ. Many Southern boys worked late into the night to erect these symbols of resistance. There were no unfortunate incidents in connection with the flags. Only regrettable incident at the Jamboree was the death of one boy from Texas. He had Polio upon arrival. He was immediately hospitalized at the Naval Hospital in Philadelphia, and two specialists flown from New York, his family doctor and parents from Texas, two nurses day and night, two iron lungs, and 16 consulting physicians could not save him.

Jimmy Wallace, who attended the Jamboree as a Medical assistant concluded that Poison Ivy, not the cold, killed 3000 of George Washington's men. Boys came into the medical tent literally covered with the stuff, and calamine, and tannic acid and rubbing alcohol were dispensed throughout the week as if it were water, and even on the train coming home, boys were still doctoring themselves.

Medical doctors for Section 7 were D. J. Rose of Goldsboro and W. K. Craig of Enfield. Assistants included Bill, Betts of Lendale, Georgia, Paul Price of Elkin, and Stratton Murrell of Jacksonville. Scoutmaster of troop 7 was Rudolph Waters. Assistants were Gilliam Wheelbee of Ahoskie, Harry Hodges of Roanoke Rapids, Senior Patrol leader was Robert

Parker of Crisp. When the train drew into Rocky Mount station at 10:45, Friday night, a column of Confederate flag-bearers made a double file in front of the door to car 11, and to the words and music of "I'm a Tar Heel born, I'm a Tar Heel bred..." Martin County's representatives to the Jamboree came home again.
