Drowning Cause Of Many Deaths

Drownings account for 5 percent of all accidental deaths. Nearly 50 percent of drowning victims are rural people and a majority of all infant drownings occur on farms.

Recent studies by NSC in several states indicate that nearly ninety percent of farm residents who drowned were non-swimmers and that the majority of all infant drownings occur in such places as stock watering tanks, cisterns, tubs, crocks, etc. The studies indicate further that the principal cause of drownings are: lack of knowledge, insufficient skill, poor judgment, and just plain carelessness.

Swimming is fine exercise, but only for those in physical condition to do it without harm. If you are not feeling well, stay out of the water. Wait for a time following meals before entering the water and do not swim if overheated. Avoid exerting beyond your strength and never dive into strange water where the depth and condition of the bottom are unknown.

The National Safety Council recommends the following precautions to reduce the needless loss of life from water sports.

1. Make a thorough investigation regarding the safety of swimming facilities.
 2. A boat nearby or a raft anchored in the pond may be useful in emergencies.
 3. Don't swim alone—never go into the water when tired, overheated or immediately after eating.
 4. Don't overload a boat. There may be seats for more people than the boat should carry.
 5. Always step into the center of the boat—never jump; never stand up in a moving boat; never permit horseplay.
 6. Old tubs, boilers, jars, or other containers should not be left around the farmstead. It takes as little as two inches of water to drown an infant.
 7. Protect stock water tanks. If possible, fence them off or cover them.
- Cisterns and wells should be inspected periodically to make sure coverings are secure.

Wake County farmers now have more than 12,000 acres in Ladino with hundreds more scheduled to go in this fall. Last year, several Wake farmers grazed their pastures for eleven and one-half months out of twelve.

Resettlement Of Displaced Persons

Washington — Barely more than half as many refugees as a year ago are being resettled from European displaced — persons camps, the International Refugee Organization (IRO), one of the United Nations Specialized Agencies, reports.

IRO's latest statistical report shows that in May 1950, the agency transported 17,576 refugees to new homes, as compared with the record of 34,070 reestablished in May 1949. Although the number of refugees resettled in the USA in May 1950 was approximately the same as one year before, immigration to France, Brazil and Israel — which accounted for large parts of the May 1949 total — has diminished greatly. IRO officials point out. In 35 months of operations, IRO has resettled 774,790 persons and repatriated 69,921.
