This is the conclusion of Dr. P. munications system. Vijayaraghavan, biochemist from India's Nutrition Research Laboratory, who is doing special protein research at the University f California at Los Angeles.

He points out that India is starved for proteins of good nutritional value because of her traditional eattle worship. While modern Indians do not today hold rigidly to the religious beliefs which deify the anmals, age-old customs have made vegetarians of them.

India's protein starvation is the basic cause of many diseases which afflict her teeming millions.

Dr. Vijayaraghavan believes it would be easier to introduce a vegetable high in protein valuesuch as peanuts-into the Indian diet than to try to make meateaters out of his countrymen. This
