Miss Della Topping, of Jamesville, is visiting Miss Hattie Lou Ward.

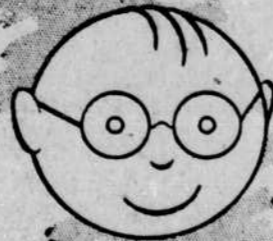
Miss Lillie Bunch has returned from a visit to Tarboro and Speed.
