Possibly if we would effect some land reforms instead of trying to maintain the old status quo favoring the few and holding the masses in servitude, we could get somebody on our side in time of need.

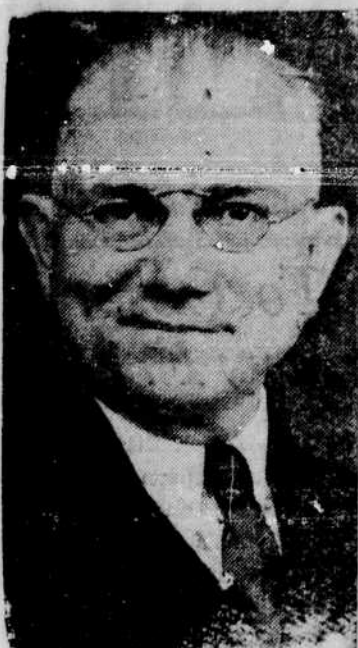
The Puzzle Within The Puzzle

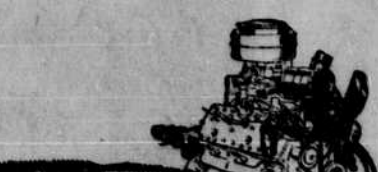
