

Bishop Wright In Address to Large Number Friday

parish were solidly laid. Then in the Spring of 1916 the Church of the Advent entered a new phase of its history. At that time the ground was broken for the present church building, and in the summer the corner stone was laid and the lovely lines of the Gothic structure began to take form, and the service of Consecration took place April 26, 1917. This building was a gift of Miss James Grist Station.

The old frame structure, the original church building has served since 1917 as quarters for the church school.

At the close of the morning Service, the Bishop, clergy, parishioners and friends enjoyed a hearty luncheon. Bishop Wright's place was marked with a replica of the original church building, complete with tower and cross, in cake and icing. Upon seeing this lovely piece of culinary art, the Bishop remarked that he had "consecrated, dedicated, and deconsecrated churches but that this would be the first time he had ever eaten one."

After the luncheon Bishop Wright made a short address, using the Scripture "Let us run the race that is set before us, seeing that we have so great a cloud of witnesses." He particularly emphasized the outstanding services of the Rev. Thomas B. Houghton, Col. Wilson G. Lamb, Mrs. James Grist Station, and Mrs. J. H. Saunders, the latter having worked with the choir for forty years. "He would be great among you, let him be as one who serves." The Bishop said, "These churches are the hope of the world." And he closed his address with these words, "God bless this day and those who have gone before, those witnesses who served Him faithfully; and let us run the race set before us, keeping our eyes on Him who said, 'I am come that ye may have life, and have it more abundantly.'"

At eight o'clock there was Evening Prayer and sermon, the Rev. Edwin F. Moseley, former rector, being guest preacher. "Reconciliation with God," was the theme of Mr. Moseley's sermon. Said Mr. Moseley, "Not just the turning of wheels, the business of running the organizations in the church, nor the smug satisfaction of having only one's family and friends as members, as if it were an exclusive club, but a prayerful and earnest effort to bring ourselves and others into closer fellowship with God, should be the aim and purpose of every one who calls himself Christian. A reconciliation with God."

At the close of the evening service a reception was held in the old church building and its replica in cake and icing cut and served by the Bishop.

Patrolmen Report Six Auto Wrecks In Past Few Days

to the Chevrolet, according to an estimate offered by Patrolman R. P. Narron who made the investigation.

Saturday afternoon at 2:45 o'clock, J. D. Gurganus was driving toward Fiat Swamp about three miles from Robersonville when Lola Purvis, colored man, darted past him in a 1941 Plymouth. Getting in front of Gurganus, Purvis slowed down quickly to make a turn and Gurganus plowed into him with his 1941 Ford, doing about \$150 damage to each machine. Herbert Purvis, riding with his brother, was cut in his right hand, Patrolman B. W. Parker, making the investigation, stating that the man almost lost a finger.

The fourth and most serious in the six-count series took place on the Hassell-Butler Bridge Road Sunday afternoon at 1:15 o'clock when the 1948 Chevrolet club coupe, driven by Postmaster George H. Leggett of Hassell, plowed into the rear of a 1941 Ford owned and driven by Leonard Audrey Glisson of RFD 1, Stokes. Both cars were traveling toward the bridge. Mr. Leggett stating that he had looked for cars on a side road, that when he again looked ahead the car was right in front of him. He added that the car appeared to him to be stopped or either backing up. Traveling between 40 and 50 miles an hour, the Chevrolet hit the Ford, throwing Mr. Jim Henry Lilly into the windshield, cutting his face badly and injuring his neck. Mr. Leggett suffered lacerations about the face and possibly a broken jaw. The driver of the other car was not hurt, according to Patrolman R. P. Narron who made the investigation. Mr. Lilly was removed to the hospital in an A. O. Roberson ambulance. Glisson said he was driving about twenty miles an hour.

No one was hurt and damage estimated at not more than \$50 resulted when Zeph Roberson, driving Chas. M. Bullock's 1941 Ford convertible, lost control and the machine ran off the concrete and down the shoulder 200 feet before turning over on Highway 125 about two and one-half miles from Williamston Sunday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. Patrolman M. F. Powers, making the investigation, said neither Roberson, a Williamston man, nor Bullock, Hamilton man, was hurt.

A United States Marine, whose name could not be learned immediately, was painfully but believed not badly hurt when the Oldsmobile in which he was riding went out of control and turned over on Highway 125 within the Oak City town limits early Monday morning. The car top was smashed in, Patrolman R. P. Narron said.
