The proposed amendment is a ogical outcome of the growth of North Carolina, We now have heavily populated areas which, while they cannot be adequately served by a single judge, cannot be carved into two judicial districts. Only by allowing the election of an additional regular judge in such areas can the problem be solved. This is the obvious solution and the only practical one. As such, it should commend itself to the voters on election day.


