### Timely Hints On The Water Supply

How should your water supply be protected from contamination? In most cases contamination entering wells comes from the area immediately around the top of the well. For this reason the location of the well - away from any source of pollution - is extremely important. Pit privies, septic tanks, barn lots, and manure pile should be fifty feet or more away and downhill from the well. Surface privies are often the source of dangerous contamination of wells and should, without exception be replaced by a sanitary pit privy or a properly constructed water flush system. Sewer lines, if they must be laid within fifty feet of the well, should be carefully laid to protect the well.

lining of concrete. Vitrified tile with outer concrete lining, or other suitable materials. Such lining should extend down at least 10 ft. and up to the well platform, cover, on pump house floor with a water tight connection. In such cases the platform or floor, should have a suitable sleeve pipe surrounding the suction pipe, or drop pipe of the pump, and projected above the floor as provided for a casing pipe. A bucket-and-rope dram should never be used, since the open top permits pollution to enter the well.

Also, everytime anyone handles the bucket and rope bacteria from his hands are introduced into the water in the well.
