a small quantity of illicit liquor, Lottie Orr Bullock pleaded guilty and was fined \$50, plus costs.
Jake Woolard, charged with cruelty to animals, pleaded not guilty. Adjudged guilty, he was fined \$25, plus costs. He appealed and bond was required in the sum of \$200. It was charged that Wool-

ard was hauling nineteen mules and horses in a truck, that the animals were so crowded that one's foot was hanging out and that one of the animals was down. Several of the animals were unloaded in Williamston.
Pleading guilty of operating a motor vehicle without a driver's license, Lola Purvis was fined \$25, plus costs.
Appearing in court for the second time for resisting arrest, James C. Brown was sentenced to the roads for six months. It was brought out that Brown had resisted the late Sheriff C. B. Roebuck when the officer attempted to take him into custody. Recently he resisted Jay Ayers, Everett's officer.

The following defendants, charged with speeding, pleaded guilty and each defendant was taxed with the costs: Max R. Leventon of Pittsburgh, Willie Perkins of Hamilton, Ben Knotts, Jr., of Plant City, Fla., and George Lee Haaker of Floral Park, New York.
Placed under a three-month suspended sentence when he was adjudged guilty of an assault and being drunk on October 9, Ophus Revels was ordered placed on the roads when he appeared in court this week to answer a public drunkenness charge. He was also booked for thirty days in a justice of the peace court for issuing a worthless check, and that was added to the sentence.

Retires After 62 Years In Service Of The Railroads

right by Mr. Ellison. Sure, he doesn't look like a Spring chicken, but he doesn't look 62, either. He walks with the vigorous, springy step of a man of 30.
"I haven't had hardly any sickness," he said. "Longest I ever stayed out was about a month way back yonder. Oh, four or five years ago I had to stay in a few days on account of what they said was congested liver. Never had the least bit of trouble with my heart, and nothing I ever put in my mouth causes me the least bother."
To the stock question, "To what do you attribute your good health?" Mr. Ellison answered "Frankly, I don't know."
"Unless," he added, "it's the fact that I never have dissipated. Why, I never took a drink of liquor in my life. I couldn't tell you the difference between whiskey, brandy, beer or anything."

Mr. Ellison didn't come from a teetotaling family, though. His father, J. H. Ellison, took a small "whiskey Collins" (whiskey, sugar and water) every morning before breakfast.
"He said it made his breakfast go down better," Mr. Ellison recalled.
Well, what is he going to do, now that he's retired?
"To tell you the truth," he replied, "I don't exactly know. Maybe I'll go fishing and hunting a little and then I'll go around visiting my friends, too. You know, working for the railroad like I've been doing, I just never felt right taking time during the day to sit down and visit with people. I know, I sort of felt like that was the Coast Line's time I was using, and I ought to put it to the company's benefit. Now I can go call on folks and stay as long as I feel like. I'll be up to see you all at the Virginian office every now and then and find out what's going on."
Mr. Ellison has one regret—the fact that he has never really cultivated a hobby to interest him after he quits.
"I spent just about all my free time with the railroad," he explained. "You know, in the old days railroading was nothing like it is today. There was no such thing as hours. And since I came to Suffolk I haven't had any regular hours—I was supposed to do whatever it took to keep things going right. On call seven days and nights a week."
The agent did have a try at golf once, but he couldn't see anything in it.
"It just looks foolish to me," he declared, "to hit a ball hard as you can, then walk a mile to knock it again."
Mr. Ellison has always been one of the first to take up any new thing that came along, though. He was the second man in Suffolk to buy an automobile—a two-cylinder Rambler which he purchased in 1907.
He also claims to be the first to buy an oil heater. And when radio came in, he was one of the select group that had the neighbors in listening to the new-fangled device.
Now he has a television set which he plans to use to while away on some of his leisure hours.
Mr. Ellison is one of the three remaining children out of the original six brought into the world by W. A. and Charlotte Isabelle Ellison. He has two sisters, Mrs. H. H. Pope, of Robersonville, N. C., and Mrs. J. Gus Goddard, of Dunn, N. C., both as hale and hearty as their older brother.
He was married in 1889 to Sallie M. Holliday, of Williamston, and has one daughter from that union, Mrs. Mary Bell Gay, of Suffolk. His wife died in 1892, and in 1900 he married Mary Louise Johnson, of Bethel, N. C. Dr. J. R. Ellison, Jr., of the Lakeview Hospital staff, is the child of that marriage.

"Oh," he said, "I've given that up. I don't want any more responsibilities. Anyway, why should I? I don't have to now."
That led to another question. Why did he buy that particular piece of property?

"Was it because you wanted to be close to the place you'd worked at so many years?" he was asked. "Certainly not," he replied. "It was because the land is right between two railroads—the Southern and Coast Line. All you have to do to get coal is have 'em dump it right there on the ground."
