The sole purpose of this amendment then, would be to authorize the General Assembly to provide for the election of more than one judge in such judicial districts as it might determine to be desirable.  
Chapter 393 of the Sessions Laws of 1949 will submit to popular vote next November a proposal to rewrite Section 10 of Article IV of the Constitution to read as follows:  
"Section 10. Judicial Districts for Superior Courts. The General Assembly shall divide the State into a number of judicial districts which number may be increased or reduced and shall provide for the election of one or more Superior Court judges for each district. There shall be a Superior Court in each county at least twice in each year to continue for such time in each county as may be prescribed by law."  
The proposed amendment relative to additional superior court judges will be submitted in the following form:  
( ) For permitting the General Assembly to prescribe the number of regular Superior Court judges in each judicial district, provided each district has at least one.  
( ) Against permitting the General Assembly to prescribe the number of regular Superior Court judges in each judicial district, provided each district has at least one."

of more than one judge in a judicial district. In some districts there is now, and has been for some time in the past a shortage of "judicial manpower," as it was termed by the Commission for the Improvement of the Administration of Justice which recommended the present Constitution. Under the present Constitution, only two remedies are available: (1) To increase the number of judicial districts thereby automatically increasing the number of elected resident judges; (2) To utilize special judges. The first is not always practical, quite aside from any political obstacles as when a large city would require more than a single judge could do; the second does not furnish a completely satisfactory solution inasmuch as the elected resident judge
