

Yield In County Slightly Better Than a Year Ago

(Continued from page one) pound today. Oil peanuts are bought on a meat content basis, meaning that a farmer who markets 100 pounds of peanuts in the shell and the peanuts grade 70 percent meat, will receive slightly above ten cents a pound for the peanut content. The buyer will pay the difference between the oil price and the market price to the Commodity Credit Corporation. The Commodity Credit, in turn, will pay that difference to the grower, less handling costs.

It is impossible to say how much the farmer will receive for his excess peanuts, but it is definite that he'll be allowed to market excess up to 1947 quotas without penalty, that he'll receive at the time of sale the price paid for oil stock for his excess, and that he'll receive something from the Commodity Credit Corporation which should bring the price for all his peanuts up to a point not too far from the regular market price. It is not known how long it will take the Commodity Credit Corporation payments to clear, possibly no longer than a few weeks or maybe it will be months. It is fairly certain that the peanut farmer with fair yields will find a favorable market this season.
