Careful Seeding Of Pasture Pays

It pays to use some type of cultipacker when seeding pastures or other small-seeded crops, believes Dewitt Anderson, Negro farmer of Rockingham County.

According to T. D. Williamson, Negro county agent in Rockingham for the State College Extension Service, Anderson has seeded two plots of alfalfa and reseeded a permanent pasture this fall.

He used a drag harrow to cover the seed in one alfalfa plot. On the other plot, he used a cultipacker. Two weeks later, he had a 90 per cent stand and good growth started on the plot seeded with the cultipacker. On the other plot he had less than a 60 per cent stand and the alfalfa was just beginning to peep out of the ground.

Anderson is hoping that the latter plot will be able to compete with the cold weather that is expected during the next two or three months.

The Rockingham County farmer is getting good results from an old renovated pasture which was seeded with Ladino clover and orchard grass on October 14. The pasture was disced, harrowed, seeded, and cultipacked with 1-1-2 tons of lime per acre and 1,000 pounds of 2-12-12 fertilizer.

Things To Watch For In the Future

Cutting a stencil by means of photography rather than by laborious typing, promises to save work and time. For original work, typing will still be necessary, since you can only photograph that which is present in typed form, but a new machine called Stenafax will be useful where it is desired to reproduce as many as 10,000 copies of an original office form, layout, or engineering drawing. A Switch that automatically cuts power when tractors reach unsafe "tilted" angles has been developed. When tilted past a "safety angle," mercury in the switch is dislodged, causing the tractor motor to stop. The driver can restart the motor, bring the tractor back to safe position. A toothbrush that delivers its own flow of water through a hollow handle to the bristles, using a rubber tube attached to the faucet, is on the market.

MOVIES ARE BETTER THAN EVER

State Third In Vehicle Sales

North Carolina ranks third in the nation in the increase in automobiles, trucks and buses in 1950, according to an estimate released by the Bureau of Public Roads of the Department of Commerce, the Department of Motor Vehicles reported today.

The estimate showed that North Carolina has 13.2 per cent increase over 1949 in these types of vehicles. Louisiana ranks first with 14.5 per cent increase and New Mexico second with 13.8.

The figures of the Bureau of Public Roads lists 720, 455 automobiles and 182,388 buses and trucks for a total of 902,843 in 1949 as compared with an estimated \$19,000 autos and 203,000 buses and trucks for a total of 1,022,000 in 1950. Actually motor vehicle registration has topped 1,158,000, but this figure includes motorcycles, motorbikes and miscellaneous types of motorized vehicles.

According to the Bureau estimate, North Carolina continues to stand 15th in the nation in registration and leads other southern states.
