Ironically, neither of the two states fall into the States' Righter category, and some of the Governors who have hollered the loudest about states' rights were the first to want federal aid.

It was reported at the meeting that Texas and North Carolina have the best Civil Defense programs in the South, with the Texas program being considered one of the best in the nation.


