

Forty Cases Are Called By Judge R. T. Johnson

William A. Mizelle, charged with careless and reckless driving, pleaded guilty of operating a motor vehicle with improper brakes. The plea was accepted.

Pleading guilty of careless and reckless driving, Eugene Rawls was fined \$50, plus costs.

In the case in which John H. Beach was charged with hit-and-run driving, the defendant pleaded guilty and was fined \$25, plus costs.

L. D. Lanier pleaded guilty of operating a motor vehicle without a driver's license and was fined \$25, plus costs.

John Connell, Jr., operating a motor vehicle with a permit two days out of date, was fined \$25, plus costs, the court later ordering the fine remitted.

Charged with speeding 45 miles an hour in a 20-mile zone, E. R. Lilley pleaded guilty and was taxed with the costs.

Pleading not guilty of violating the liquor laws, T. Taylor was adjudged guilty and was sentenced to the roads for six months. The road term was suspended upon the payment of a \$50 fine, plus costs. He is to violate no criminal law for two years.

Charged with operating a motor vehicle while his driver's license was revoked, S. J. Dixon was adjudged guilty and was fined \$200, plus costs. Notice of appeal was given and bond was required in the sum of \$500.

Charging with driving 40 miles or more in a 20-mile zone, Bernman Briley and Garfield Manning were each taxed with the costs.

George Purvis was fined \$25, plus costs, for operating a motor vehicle without a driver's license.

Thomas J. Simpkins was taxed with the costs in the case charging him with careless and reckless driving.

Charged with drunken driving, Jesse Latham pleaded not guilty. He was adjudged guilty of public drunkenness and was fined \$10, plus costs. It was brought out that the defendant was riding a bicycle.

Pleading guilty of drunken driving and operating a motor vehicle without a driver's license, Sam H.

Whitehurst was fined \$125, plus costs.

V. L. Daughtry, pleading guilty of reckless driving, was sentenced to the roads for four months, the court suspending the road term upon the payment of a \$50 fine, plus costs. He is to violate no criminal law during the next two years.

Charged with an assault, Boston Gainer was found not guilty. Charged with operating a motor vehicle without a driver's license and parking a vehicle on the highway at night without a light, Eddie Johnson was fined \$40, plus costs.

William Ruffin was sentenced to the roads for six months for assaulting a female.

The cases charging Clelmer Wiggins with being drunk and disorderly and Lazarus Rivers with an assault with a deadly weapon were not pressed.
