

Accepting Men With Dependents

The local Army and Air Force Recruiting Sergeant announced Austing Nichols has relaxed its restrictions on the enlistment of men with dependents.

The recruiting service further stated that men who are veterans and eligible to enlist in the Air Force in the grade of sergeant or higher may be enlisted now without regards to the number of dependents.

In addition, men without prior service and men with prior service not eligible to be enlisted in grade of sergeant or higher, may be enlisted now if they have no more than two dependents.

The recruiting service also stated that any man who had applied for enlistment in the Army or the Air Force in the past several months and who was not eligible at that time because of the fact they had dependents should recontact the local recruiting sergeant located in the post office building to determine their eligibility under the new regulations.
