### Detection Center Saves Thousands

By making every doctor's office a cancer detection center we can save 100,000 otherwise doomed men, women, and children, all over the United States in the next twelve months. This is the statement made by Clive Howard in a current article. This scientific estimate was made from evidence in actual experience. Hillsdale County in Michigan began a campaign January 1, 1948, to remedy their high cancer mortality rate. During the first two years, the Hillsdale doctors examined 1721 patients, and found 65 cases of cancer. One-third were in the early stage; another 29 per cent were only moderately advanced. They discovered that they were finding twice as many cases as formerly and soon enough so that treatment is almost always successful.

The article continues by saying that in Hillsdale County, fear of cancer has been replaced by knowledge. It has become routine for citizens of the county to have examinations for cancer, and their doctors stress the importance of repeated checkups at six months or one year intervals. The most effective way to save sufferers of cancer is to detect the disease in its early stages. This can only be accomplished if every man and woman will cooperate by asking for periodic cancer examinations, and if doctors will be on the alert for early and curable cancers.

Cancer detection centers at Elizabeth City and Rocky Mount, have been in operation for a little more than a year. Examinations are given without cost and are available to all women thirty-five or over, all men forty or over. In addition, those who are under thirty-five are eligible for examination if they have any of the recognized "Danger Signals of Cancer." Upon request the clinic will be glad to send booklets explaining cancer symptoms. Address your requests to Cancer Clerk, Health Center, Elizabeth, Rocky Mount.

### Army Calling For Nurses-Specialists

The Army has issued a second call for volunteer nurses and women medical specialists to meet expanded needs. It wants 3,000 nurses and 250 women medical workers by June 30. A first call, issued in August, brought in 477 nurses and 17 specialists.
