

Van R. Page Goes To Supreme Court In Robbery Case

case in which he was charged with cruelty to animals, was sentenced to the roads for sixty days. He was allowed to give bond in the sum of \$250 until January 2 when he is to surrender himself before noon to Sheriff M. W. Holoman.

Pleading guilty of non-support, Thomas Kirkman was sentenced to the roads for six months, the court suspending the road term upon the payment of \$10 a week for the support of his family, a \$148 medical bill and costs.

The case charging R. L. Sikes with issuing a worthless check, was continued until the March term on account of the defendant's illness.

Charged with an assault with a deadly weapon, Walter Wilson Knight was found not guilty by jury.

General Columbus Freeman, charged with drunken driving, pleaded not guilty. Convicted in the county court on the charge, Freeman was fined \$200, plus costs, and he appealed. After the evidence was heard, Judge Bone explained to the defendant's attorney that if the jury found his client guilty a road sentence

could be expected. The plea was changed to one of guilty, and the judgment of the lower court was upheld.

Linwood (Dummy) Speight, charged with burglary, was found not guilty by jury. Speight, rightly or wrongly convicted on numerous other occasions for breaking and entering and larceny, had his interpreter but no attorney, he literally skidded out of the charge that he entered the Mad White home in Williamston on the night of September 16. He maintained that he had been keeping company with one of the occupants in the rooming house, that he went there while she was away to get some of his clothing. Speight, released by directed verdict for allegedly breaking into a Williamston filling station, was arrested for the alleged boarding house crime after gaining his freedom a few hours before. He had been in jail since that time.

At the conclusion of the evidence in the case in which Robt. Savage was charged with breaking and entering and larceny, the court directed a verdict of not guilty.

disease may not be in all fields or on the farm in question.

Two years' experience has shown that the yield and value per acre of Dixie Bright 101 are an improvement over many of the non-resistant varieties being grown at present. Thus, say Bennett and Nusbaum, a grower may not have to sacrifice anything in switching to this variety and thus reducing his chances of heavy loss the first year a disease appears.

Deaths from burns are close to a thousand a month in December, January and February. National Safety Council figures show. The principal reasons are defective heating appliances (or improper use of them) and defective chimneys. In summer months the burn toll is nearer 300 a month.

Farm Marketing Income Increase

Farmers' cash receipts from marketings in November are estimated at 3.1 billion dollars. 14 percent less than in October but 8 percent more than a year ago.

The expected decline from October is a reflection of seasonally smaller marketings, as prices will probably average about the same. Higher prices, however, will account for any increase in cash receipts over last year.

Receipts from livestock and products in November may total about 1.6 billion dollars, 9 percent less than in October but nearly 20 percent more than in November of 1949. Both marketings and prices were down slightly from October, but they will be considerably above those of a year ago.

November receipts from meat animals may be as much as 30 percent higher than last November, though somewhat below the October level.

Receipts from dairy products in November may be about 8 percent less than in the previous month because marketings will be down seasonally, but they will probably be about the same as last November.

On the other hand, receipts from poultry and eggs may be about 15 percent above October as a result of seasonally larger sales of eggs and turkeys, and probably about the same as a year ago.

Crop receipts in November are estimated at 1.5 billion dollars, 10 percent below the seasonal peak in October and probably close to those of a year earlier.
