Carroll, whose real name was Charles Ludwidge Dodgson, was a clergyman and a professor of mathmatics at Christ Church at the time. Though "Alice in Wonderland" was not writen and published until 1865, Carroll first told the story at a summer afternoon picnic in 1862.
