There were less good to choice grades marketed and more low and fair qualities. Also, the proportion of nondescript was larger. However, more lugs and cutters were sold. Low to good leaf, low and fair cutters, low to good lugs, good smoking leaf and nondescript comprised the bulk of offerings.  
Deliveries to the Flue-cured Stabilization Corporation under the Government loan program this week were around 2.5 percent of gross sales. This was the largest proportion received in the past weeks. Season receipts stand at about 6 percent of the sales.

### Expect Increase In Holiday Trade

New York—The nation's retailers are beginning to brighten up a bit. Plagued with over-heavy inventories and consumer apathy for the past several months, the merchants are now looking forward to the Christmas season with something akin to hopefulness.  
Most retailers say they are expecting a good Christmas trade. Business may not be as good as last Christmas, which benefited from the second round of the Korean-war-inspired "scare buying," but most business men can foresee a fairly prosperous season ahead.  
One of the things heartening the merchants is the big boom in sales over Columbus Day—traditionally regarded as the "kick-off" date for the winter season and an indication of how Christmas sales should go. Some retailers, in fact, reported sales over the Columbus Day week-end as "phenomenal."

### Ten Counties Win Pasture Awards

Ten North Carolina counties have won special awards for outstanding work in promoting the "Green Pastures" campaign sponsored by the State USDA Council.  
The counties are Alamance, Cabarrus, Currituck, Davie, Forsyth, Graham, Haywood, Macon, Stanly and Wake. Stanly was given special recognition because it led the State. More than one-third of all farmers in the county have established at least one acre of improved pasture for each animal unit on the farm.  
Some 1,719 farmers of the State have been awarded "Green Pastures" certificates and 622 have been awarded plaques. Certificates are given on the basis of one acre of improved pasture for each animal unit, and plaques are awarded on the basis of at least 1-1/2 acres of improved pasture per animal unit.  
Banners provided by the National Fertilizer Association will be presented to the top ten counties at county-wide meetings to be held during the next few weeks. Each banner is four by six feet in size and contains the words "Green Pastures Citation, 1951" in white letters on a green background.  
The "Green Pastures" campaign is conducted by the State USDA Council in cooperation with "Green Pastures" committees in each county.
