

### Water And Sewer Program Cost Ran Up To \$203,070.60

from six to eight feet at \$110 each, \$550; and one from eight to ten feet in depth, \$150.

Miscellaneous items or other costs connected with the projects were listed and approved by the commissioners, as follows:

Reed and Horton, Boston bond attorneys, \$350.88; Security Bank, printing bonds, \$130.50; Tidewater, \$41.82; G. and H. Builders Supply Co., \$567.61; Lynchburg Foundry, \$248.58; Lilley Manufacturing Co., \$287.75; Chas. H. Manning, legal, \$1,500; Housing and Home Finance Agency, \$2,000 for the first sewer line survey; Farmers Supply Co., \$31.50; Grinnell Co., pipe connections for tank, \$180.08; Fairbanks Morse Co., pump, \$1,286.28.

The difference between the income from the bond sale and the cost of the completed projects was made up out of the special sewer tax fund.

Several thousand dollars are now in the special sewer tax fund, but it will be spent to make connections with the new lines. It is also planned to build up a reserve, looking forward to the time when another main outfall line can be laid to place the sanitary service in reach of every building in the town.

Saying she was a cousin of the murdered man, the witness said that the woman and Sheppard were not married but that they had been living together as man and wife, that parties were held in the Sutton home Friday and Saturday nights nearly every week.

It was reported soon after the attack that the woman was first attacked in her bed room, that Gus Andrews freed her and she ran to the kitchen where she stabbed her assailant with the ice pick.

Reports from other areas to the south state that the government has figured prominently in the market. Clarkton opened a government warehouse day before yesterday and received twenty loads the first day. However, the open market was said to have been fairly active there, too.

While no sales have been reported in this county, first deliveries were reported in Bertie earlier in the week. Of five lots offered for sale, four were rejected because of high moisture content. Prices paid for the one acceptable lot were based strictly on support figures, it was reported.

**Bomb Shelters Planned For Seventy Big Cities**

Seventy of the heavily populated cities of the nation are being visited by experts of the Federal Civil Defense Administration to conduct surveys.

They will give advice to local civil-defense authorities on measurement of shelter facilities of existing buildings, and of the modifications needed to make them suitable. FCDA officials have estimated that 62,000,000 persons live in the so far unnamed critical-target areas and that half of them are in congested commercial or industrial zones during daytime working hours.

The Federal Seed Act requires that seed shipped in interstate commerce be labeled in such way that buyers may be properly guided in selecting seed to meet their needs.

### Rail Rate Rise Granted To Southern Carriers

The Interstate Commerce Commission has granted the Southern railroads a ten per cent increase in passenger fares and, at the same time, these lines were authorized to hike their minimum fare-way ticket from 15 cents to 20 cents. The raises were asked last May by 27 railroads. The current military furlough rate of 2 cents a mile will not be affected when the revisions are made.
