- 1 cup ready-mix for pancakes (plain)
 - 2 tablespoons cornmeal
 - 1 tablespoon sugar
 - 2-3 cup water
 - 8 wieners
 - Fat for frying
- Combine dry ingredients. Add water and beat with electric mixer or rotary beater for 2 minutes. Dip wieners in batter—holding wiener with a kitchen fork; drain off excess batter over bowl. Fry in hot deep fat (375 degrees F.) for 2 to 3 minutes. Drain on absorbent paper. Insert wooden skewers and serve while hot and crisp. Don't forget to include a bowl of mustard for dipping!

Warren's Bid For Nomination Stirs Republican Ranks

Los Angeles.—The political independence of Gov. Earl Warren has paid off handsomely in his own state of California. How will his special position—appealing to voters of both parties and remaining somewhat aloof from the professional Republican Party machinery—work elsewhere, now that he is running for the party nomination?

There is important resistance to his nomination, here in his home state. It may call national attention both to the problems and the possibilities of an independent candidate.

California has five registered Democrats for every three Republicans, yet Governor Warren has won the state's top office three times. Why? In large part, it is believed, because he could get the independent vote that is nominally Democratic.

In the last state election, for instance, it was widely trusted Earl Warren against widely questioned James Roosevelt, and it didn't take a big Republican machine to return the Governor to office. It took independent Democrats.

In the view of political observers, the Warren success as an independent explains his comparative aloofness from party organization. It has been Warrenism, not Republicanism, that has elected him.

Those who oppose Governor Warren, wanting a regular Republican, point out that it expected that as vice-presidential team-mate with Gov. Thomas G. Dewey of New York in 1948, Gov. Warren would sweep the West. But he didn't.

The Governor has vigorous enemies in this state who resent not only his liberalism but his aloofness from the party. They say he has appointed too many Democrats to office. They decry his liberalism.

On the other hand, the group of Republicans, mostly officeholders, who have asked him to seek the presidency include convinced believers that his independence is a true interpretation of today's need.

They believe that Warren Republicanism is winning Republicanism—middle ground, internationalism, seeking conservative application of liberal ideals.

This group forms the nucleus for an organized campaign in the Governor's behalf. Its momentum will depend partly on local and national factors not yet fully revealed. The other factor—that the Governor seems sure to take to Chicago one of the country's largest delegations—it not being underevaluated here.

Since 17 top-ranking Californian Republicans asked the Governor to declare himself, 48 other prominent Californian Republicans have added their names to the list.

This means a virtual certainty that the Republican State Central Committee will set up a slate of delegates pledged to the Governor as California's favorite son. But it does not preclude the possibility that there will be another Republican slate otherwise pledged.
