

Cheese May Be Product of Seed

Scientists at the Texas Engineering Experiment Station in College Station, Texas, currently are conducting research projects to develop a cheese type food from cottonseed.

Results obtained thus far on the cottensed cheese are of a preliminary nature. Curds prepared from cottonseed protein solutions

were similar to the curds obtained from milk. However, certain technical problems will have to be solved before cheese can be successfully produced from cottonseed for use as a food product.

Present research work at the experiment station is being directed toward the solution of these problems.

Green Wave Girls Win First Start; Boys Edged Out

Both Teams Show Signs Of Developing Good Offensive This Season

Basketball teams of Williamston High divided a doubleheader with teams from Elizabeth City High School Tuesday night in the Williamston gym, the Williamston girls won the first game, 23-17, and the Green Wave boys dropping a 37-34 decision to a team sporting several polished players who hit the nets for the difference in the scoring.

Coach Jean DeWitt of the girls' team used 11 players against the visitors and their play indicated a strong sextet may be developed as the season progresses. Coach Carroll Blackerby used 10 boys in various positions in an effort to work out a combination under pressure. Prospects for the Williamston boys were considered to be good, also.

Although the Williamston girls were ahead at the end of every quarter of play, the score was close most of the way. The widest Williamston margin in the first half came in the first minute of the second quarter when the score reached 8-3 but the widest margin of the game was midway the final period when the Green Wave girls held a 19-12 lead.

The Elizabeth City girls proved excellent shots from the foul line as they made five out of 7 tries while Williamston could get only 5 out of 16. Williamston was in front 4-3 at the first quarter, 9-6 at the half, 14-12 at the three-quarter mark. It was largely a defensive game with Williamston's team, new except for two or three players, showed some hesitancy in shooting.

Scoring for Williamston were: Donnette Bailey 10, Sarah Everett 5, Dolly Wynne 4, Ann Raynor 1, Edna Mizelle 1. Starters were Bailey, Everett and Dolly Wynne at forwards, Wanda Jones, Priscilla Roberson and Jean Ward Mobley at guard. Others getting into the game included: Patricia Wynne, Geraldine Ward and Anne Peele. Bailey, the only returning player at forward with any experience, played a good team game.

The boys' game started off like wildfire with Elizabeth City scoring in the first few seconds and James Coltrain laying one in for Williamston less than half a minute later. Fouled, Coltrain made it 2-2 Williamston at the end of the first minute. A few seconds later the visitors grabbed the lead again with a field goal and went out front to stay with a shot at the 3.9 minute mark. Ross cut the margin with a field goal but the visitors came back with another and lead 12-8 at the quarter.

Starters for Williamston were John Rogers and Harrell Everett at guard, Jack Ross at center, James Coltrain and Watson McKeel at forward. Starting the second quarter Bobby Mobley went in for Ross. The visitors made four field goals in two minutes to go ahead, 20-8.
