

### Great Film At The Viccar Thursday

Another great film biography comes to the local screen on Thursday when "Jim Thorpe—All American," starring Burt Lancaster in the title role, opens at the Viccar Theatre. A tender love story, a thrilling sportsman's saga, a story of an American Indian who became one of the most widely acclaimed heroes of his day, the real life story of Jim Thorpe packs more interest and drama than half a dozen fictional pieces.

Phyllis Thaxter plays the girl for whom Jim turned from track to the glamorous sport of football to become the nation's number one star. He apparently impressed her, a fellow student at Carlisle Indian School, for they were married when Thorpe returned from Europe where he performed the prodigious feat of winning both decathlon and pentathlon events in the 1912 Olymp-

pics. It was in Stockholm that the King of Sweden crowned him champ and said, "You, sir, are the greatest athlete in the world."

Charles Bickford essays the role of "Pop" Warner, the coach and friend of Thorpe. Steve Cochran, Jack Big Head and Suni Warcloud are also in the cast of Jim Thorpe—All American," for Warner.
