an agency of the State," the opinion explained, and therefore are not matters on which the courts can act as the expert.

To sue the highway commissioners as individuals, the opinion added, had the effect of directing the commissioners as individuals

to do what they as individuals have no power to do.
"The courts cannot compel a member of the State Highway Commission to vote for a particular project," the Supreme Court said, "(even) though it be alleged that it is in the interest of public safety."

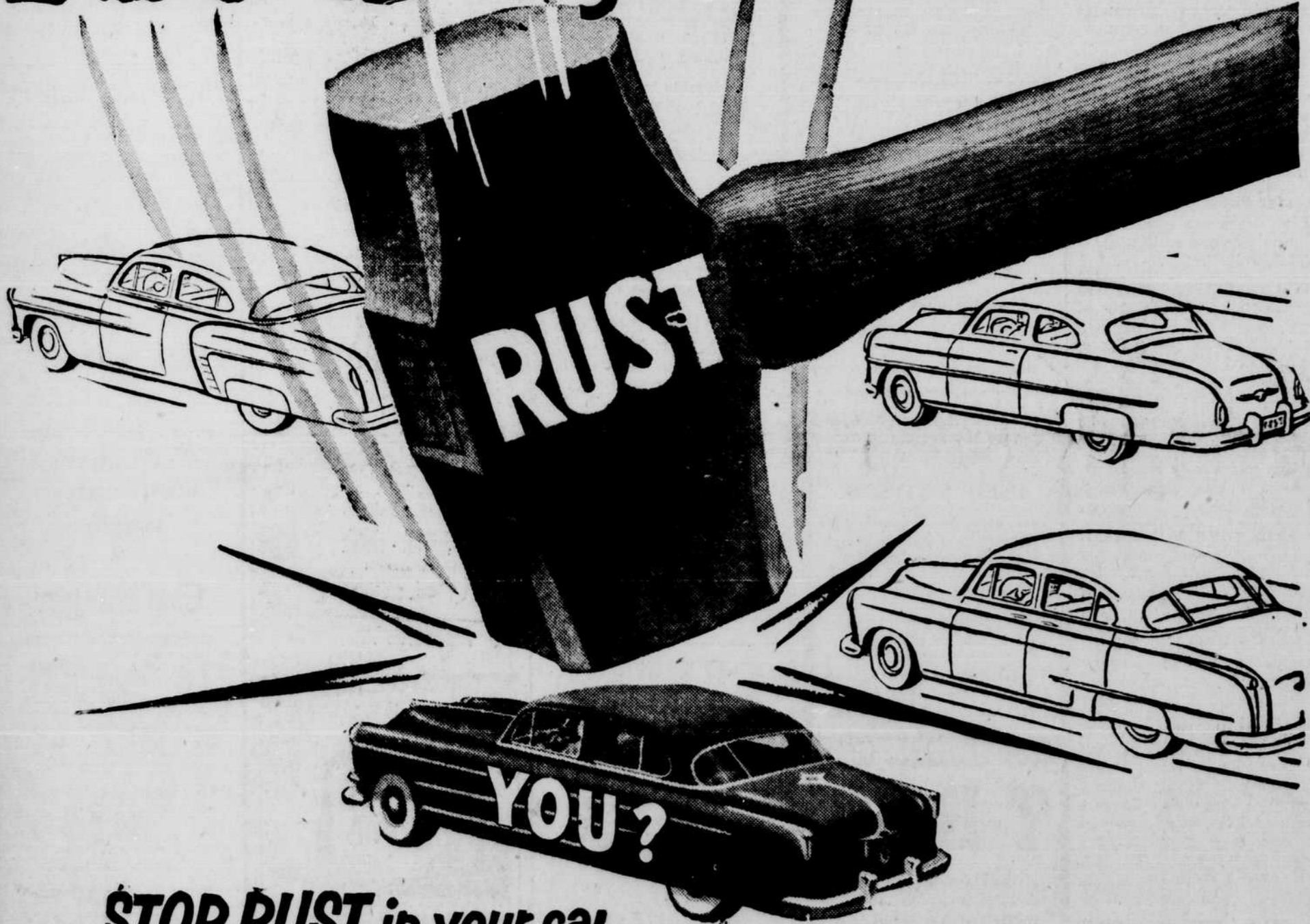

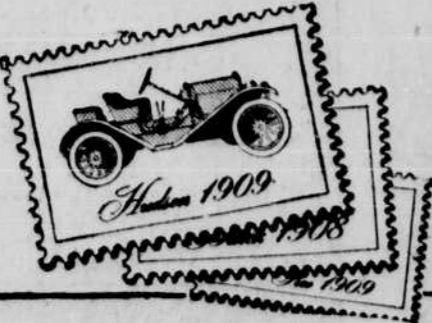
