Jamesville PTA Holds Meeting

The October meeting of the Jamesville Parent-Teacher Association was held Thursday night, October 16 at the school auditorium.

Mr. Daniel Hardison led the group in a brief period of devotion before Phyllis Gaines, a student, presented a piano solo, "Hungarian Rapsody No. 2."

Miss Peggy Barrow, program chairman, then introduced Miss Mary Taylor who told the group about the part the Welfare Department plays in the well-being of Martin County children. In addition to their work with attendance, she outlined their work with children who have body defects and need the attention of specialists, those who are normal but need financial assistance to permit them to remain in the public school, and those who need glasses, or other medical attention which their parents cannot afford. Miss Taylor urged members of the group to offer their criticisms and suggestions for better functioning of their department.

Mrs. Carl Griffin, with the use of charts and books explained the new report card that is being used to measure progress of the pupils in the primary grades.

A motion was made and carried to appropriate \$150 from the P. T. A. Treasury to be applied toward buying 200 new books for the school library. This would enable our library to qualify for the highest rating which could be awarded our school and would fulfill one of the few remaining requirements for this rating.

The meeting was concluded with trumpet solo, "Kiss of Fire" by Don Baker.
