

New Chevrolet Display Friday

Detroit. — Record-breaking crowds are expected to throng Chevrolet dealer showrooms this week-end for the debut of 1953 passenger car and truck models. Scheduled for public display for the first time on Friday, January 9, the new line embraces the most far-reaching improvements in Chevrolet history.

W. E. Fish, general sales manager of the company, bases a forecast of a record turnout on three significant factors.

"First, reports of Chevrolet development work around Detroit have kindled more interest than in any previous model," said Fish. "Secondly, dealers are expending money and effort to make the event a success.

"A third reason for anticipating large crowds is that dealers are extending their introductory period over two days. Traditionally, Chevrolet has displayed new models on Saturday. By unveiling the 1953 cars Friday, dealers will have two days to be hosts to the public before the Sunday closing."

Fish added that highway demonstrations will play a more important part than in former announcements because of the number of added performance features in the new cars.

for income tax purposes, it was pointed out.

The organization, a tobacco growers cooperative marketing association, was set up for the purpose of stabilizing the price of tobacco at 90 percent of parity on the warehouse floor. That is its primary objective; a distribution of net gains is secondary to the real purpose of the organization, Mr. Weeks expressly pointed out in a special letter.

Receipts of the stabilization cooperative in 1952 were the second highest since the organization was created. The 1947 crop receipts amounted to 232 million pounds. Through the 19th of last month, the cooperative's receipts added up to 164,357,902 pounds or almost eleven percent of the poundage marketed.

At the present time, Stabilization has stocks of tobacco on hand totaling approximately 220 million pounds (dry weight). This includes 1952 receipts plus 73 million pounds of old crop tobacco.

A Washington report says that the nation's three most famous documents, the Declaration of Independence, the Constitution, and the Bill of Rights, which have been sealed in helium, are to be elevated into their showcases each morning, and descend into their safe each night, by an unusual arrangement soon to be completed at the National Archives. The account says the Declaration rises from the safe into a case built against the wall like a picture-frame.
