

# Ernest E. Stalon Says He's Ready For Gas Chamber

(Continued From Page One)

Ernest E. Stalon returned home where he remained until 7:20 o'clock. Making his second trip to the mill, Stalon started his usual work as a mechanic's helper, and was transferred a short time later to the boiler room to take over Hassell's duties. He remained silent as the search for Hassell progressed during the morning and continued at the post until 4:30 o'clock that afternoon when all the employees of the mill were directed to report to the mill office.

Stalon said he removed the rifle from under the fly wheel and threw it into the furnace along with the stolen money, the amount of which has not been definitely determined. The man, a World I veteran and the father of three small children, first denied any knowledge of the crime.

Although Stalon still maintains that he threw the wallet and money into the boiler furnace, Chief Wm. Smith and Officer Wade Vick searched the home Tuesday evening and found \$133 in bills in a book. Stalon's wife said he entered the room where the money was found between trips to the mill Monday morning. She did not know it was there.

Stalon was not taken into custody that afternoon, but when officers learned that he had said he was going to kill Hassell and get his job, and that if he killed a man he would kill his wife and children, they went to his home Monday evening about 8:30 o'clock to question him further. Stalon, already retired, got up and turned the officers in. Asked where his rifle was, Stalon said it was broken, that he considered it no good and threw it into the trash week before last. An extensive search for the rifle was started, Sheriff Holoman stating that Stalon's wife had told Chief Smith that she saw the gun in their home as late as last Thursday. The trash pile was searched and town employees were questioned along with scavengers of the town dump, but none of them had seen anything of the gun.

The officers took a recess at midnight Monday after planning to center the search in and around the mill after the boiler cooled. Mr. Willie Taylor, the mill owner, and Joe Nichols, a company em-

ployee, searched the boiler Tuesday morning and found the rifle far to the back. Stalon had thrown it over the fire and since the mill was closed down about the time he threw it into the furnace, it was not badly burned. After cleaning the weapon, the officers carried it to Stalon's wife who identified it. Others also identified the weapon.

Confronted with the late evidence, Stalon finally broke down and admitted the murder. The murder victim had been a faithful employee of the Taylor Mill and Gin Company and its former owners for about half a century. He lived a good life, and reared several generations of children.

Stalon had been employed at the mill for about five years. The mill owner and fellow employees became worried over Hassell's mysterious disappearance Monday morning, knowing that it was not his way to leave his job without notifying someone. Mr. Taylor personally checked the mill yard, going outside where Hassell was said to have maintained rabbit boxes. He delegated other workers to help with the search. Hassell was known to have had a minor heart condition, and doctors' offices were contacted.

Shortly before 11:00 o'clock that morning, Sawyer Woodcock was walking down the steps from the saw filing room and noticed one of the steps had been moved out of place. He called Mr. Taylor and while they were making an examination there they noticed the saw dust had been moved about. They found the body a few minutes later.

There was not too much evidence of foul play, but Coroner W. W. Biggs was called and he examined the body, an X-ray and autopsy showing the man was killed by two bullets in his head.
