Sleight-Of-Hand Method

It would appear that Secretary Ezra T. Benson and his followers have been employing sleight-of-hand methods in advancing the flexible farm price program.

There may be some opposition to the 90 percent plan, but reports from the grass roots in those very areas where the flexible advocates claimed a strong following, declare that the farmers not only want 90 percent but also 100 percent parity.

claim to strong support for his flexible pet, a mid-western Senator declared that a candidate either Democrat or Republican, is doomed if he votes for flexibles.

Depression Bureaucracy

Many volumes have been written about New and Fair Deal Bureaucracy, but the cold facts and figures show that that bureaucracy wasn't so bad after all.

A look at the record shows that when silent government held forth in Washington as many as 154 business firms out of every 10,000 failed annually.

When Franklin Roosevelt went to Washington he and his bureaucracy dropped the business failures from 154 to 100 the first year. By 1936 the count was down to 46.

Let the failure figure climb back to 150 or even 100, and many Republicans and a whole lot of Isenocrats will call for bureaucracy of the Roosevelt-Truman brand.

He Calls It "Foul Play"

Congressman Harold H. Velde, a member of the corrupt McCarthy team, is having a battle for his political life out in Illinois. It was Velde's committee that charged protestant churches with harboring communists.

Citizens of his district have prepared a pamphlet, entitled, "Religious Leadership vs. McCarthyism and Veldeism." The Velde camp says the pamphlet is "unethical," and that the church people have resorted to "foul play."

It would seem that the meaning of "ethical" is about to be thrown into reverse, that McCarthy, Velde and Company think it ethical to make unfounded charges, run rough shod over the helpless and promote character assassination.

Chronic VA Patients Over 50 Per Cent

A census conducted by the Veterans Administration on January 31, 1953, showed that 51.7 percent of the 104,820 patients in VA and non-VA hospitals with the VA footing the bill had been hospitalized more than a year and 66.5 percent had been patients more than 90 days.

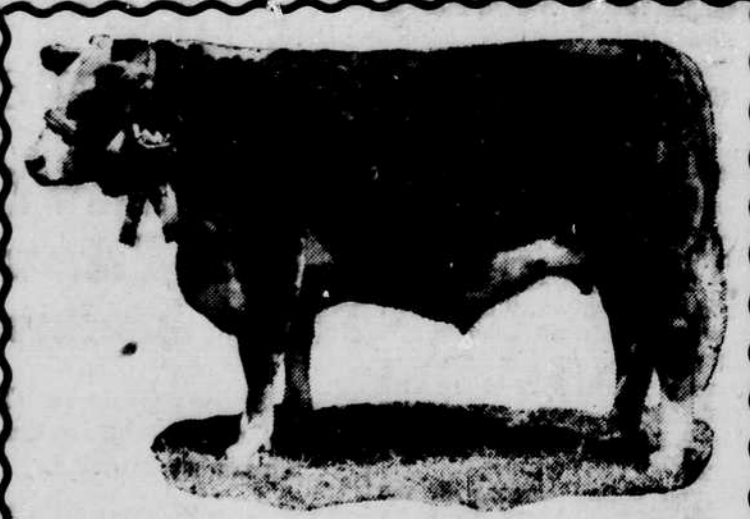
