## Artists To Appear In Windsor Church

Windsor—The Woman's Auxiliary to the Bertie County Memorial Hospital, will sponsor the appearance of two noted Virginia musicians in a program at the Cashie Baptist Church, Windsor on Sunday evening, May 2, at 8 p. m.

They are Hal J. Lyon, Franklin organist, and his protege, Nelson Edens, vocalist.

The program will last for approximately an hour and a half. Mr. Lyon has played the organ from early childhood and gained a nation-wide reputation at a young age in theater organ solo work.

His first organ teacher was C. Albert Scholin, who is not head of the organ department at Columbia College in Missouri.

Later he studied at the American Conservatory in Chicago, under Frank Van Dusen. Further organ instruction was received from Dr. Alexander McCurdy, of Curtis Institute in Philadelphia, and also from Mr. Frederick Kinsley, organist and choirmaster at Riverside Church in New York.

He studied conducting and choral methods with Dr. John Finley Williamston at Westminster Choir College in Princeton.

A dedication service was recently held for the \$15,000 three-manual pipe organ that Mr. Lyon donated to the High Street Methodist Church in honor of his mother, Mrs. Clara Parker Lyon. She will accompany him on his visit to Windsor Sunday.

The vocalist, Nelson Edens, Jr., bass, is a resident of Franklin and the son of the Rev. Nelson P. Edens and Mrs. Edens of Parkton.

In February of last year Mr. Edens took first place in State-wide auditions held by the National Federation of Music Clubs in Richmond and represented the State in district auditions at Charleston, W. Va.

## No Teen-Agers' Night Planned Here Saturday

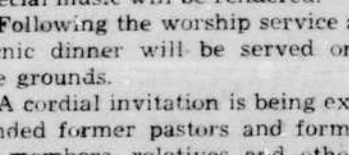
