#### Parroi Fever Is Increasing

On May 30 the Public Health Service in Washington announced that more persons have been afflieted with psittacosis, commonly called parrot fever, this year than in previous years. An official stated that parakeets bootlegged into this country in violation of regulations for quarantine may be in responsible. A great many parakeets have been brought in without passing quarantine regulations. So far 123 cases of parrot fever have been reported in 1954 which is approximately the total figure for all of 1953. Formerly fatal, the disease is now supposed to be curable. Human beings catch it through infected birds. Besides parrots and parakeets, turkeys, pigeons and other kinds of birds may be carriers.


