Clean-up is catching! The story of how Clean-up Week began is ample proof of that.

The year was 1909. A young teacher in a poor district school in Cleveland had taken a special fancy to one ragged little girl in her class. One day, on impulse, she bought a little blue pinafore and gave it to the child. She washed the youngster's grimy face and

combed the unkempt hair—and it was a clean, pretty little girl who stepped into the room.

### U. S. Economy Shows Some Signs Of Rising

The U. S. economy has reported two hopeful economic signs. The Federal Reserve Board reported the industrial production index had risen for the first time since last July. The Labor and Commerce Departments predict a record year of new building.
