IS HERBERT HOOVER ELIGIBLE FOR PRESIDENTIAL NOMINATION?

A correspondent calls our attention to a provision of the Constitution, which says:

"No person except a natural-born citizen, or a citizen of the United States at the time of the adoption of this Constitution, shall be eligible to to the office of President; neither shall any person be eligible to that office who shall not have attained to the age of thirty-five years and been fourteen years a resident within the United States."






