**AN ORDINANCE**  
To Authorize the Town of Tarboro To Issue \$15,000.00 of Bonds For Sewer System.

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Tarboro:

Section 1. That the Town of Tarboro, under and pursuant to the authority contained in the Municipal Finance Act, do issue its bonds for the purpose of constructing a sanitary sewer system in and for said town.

Section 2. The maximum aggregate principal amount of said bonds shall be \$15,000.00.

Section 3. That in each year while any of said bonds shall be outstanding, a tax shall be levied and collected in accordance with law, sufficient to pay the principal and interest on said bonds as same shall fall due.

Section 4. That a statement of the debt of the Town of Tarboro has been filed with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners, pursuant to The Municipal Finance Act, and is open to public inspection.

Section 5. The average assessed valuation of property subject to taxation by the Town of Tarboro for the three fiscal years in which taxes were last levied, as shown by said statement, is \$2,485,656.00.

Section 6. The amount of the net debt of the Town of Tarboro outstanding or authorized, including the bonds herein authorized, is \$289,657.

Section 7. That this ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication, unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under The Municipal Finance Act, and in such event it shall take effect when approved by the voters of the municipality at an election as provided for in the said The Municipal Finance Act.

The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 19th day of May, 1920, and was first published on the 14th day of May, 1920.

Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication.

**AN ORDINANCE**  
To Authorize the Town of Tarboro To Issue \$33,000.00 of Bonds For The Purpose of Constructing Culverts Within Said Town.

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Tarboro:

Section 1. That the Town of Tarboro issued its bonds for the purpose of constructing culverts over water courses within said town, said bonds to be issued under and pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act:

Section 2. The maximum aggregate principal amount of said bonds shall be \$33,000.00.

Section 3. That in each year while any of said bonds shall be outstanding, a tax shall be levied and collected, in accordance with law, sufficient to pay the principal and interest on said bonds as same fall due.

Section 4. That a statement of the debt of the Town of Tarboro has been filed with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners, pursuant to The Municipal Finance Act, and is open to public inspection.

Section 5. The average assessed valuation of property subject to taxation by the Town of Tarboro for the three fiscal years in which taxes were last levied, as shown by said statement, is \$2,485,656.00.

Section 6. The amount of the net debt of the Town of Tarboro outstanding or authorized, including the bonds herein authorized, is \$289,348.

Section 7. That this ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication, unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under The Municipal Finance Act, and in such event it shall take effect when approved by the voters of the municipality at an election as provided for in the said The Municipal Finance Act.

The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 16th day of May, 1920, and was first published on the 14th day of May, 1920.
