ADVERTISING AND PRICES. The ancient ilea that the cost of advertising is added to prices was nearly exposed by Dean Johnson of the New York University school of commerce in a recent address.

Mr. Johnson showed that you can't get large scale production without advertising. Advertising lowers the prices by making it possible to do business in great volume with the minimum of overhead cost.

Where advertising has brought quanaity production, it becomes possible to standardize every operation so it can be done with a minimum of expense.

The same principle applies to retail distribution. You can't get low prices without distribution in considerable volume, and you can't get volume of business without advertising
