**NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION**  
In Town of Pinetops on Bond Ordinance, Entitled "An Ordinance to Authorize the Town of Pinetops, N. C., to Issue \$25,000.00 of Bonds For an Electric Light and Power System."

Notice is hereby given that a special election will be held in the Town of Pinetops on Tuesday, the 23rd day of November, 1920, at the regular polling place, under the power and authority granted in the Municipal Finance Act of the General Assembly of North Carolina, to determine whether or not the Town of Pinetops shall issue bonds in an aggregate maximum principal amount of \$25,000.00 for the establishment of an electric light and power system in the Town of Pinetops. The Board of Commissioners have duly passed a bond ordinance for this purpose, to be effective only upon approval by the voters of said Town of Pinetops, said ordinance being as follows:

"The Board of Commissioners of the Town of Pinetops realizing the necessity of providing electric lighting and power facilities within the Town of Pinetops, by either erecting and operating an electric plant within said Town, or by purchasing such electric light and power under contract with the Town of Tarboro, or other municipal or private corporation, do this the 18th day of October, 1920, at a meeting specially called and advertised for this purpose, do hereby ordain and enact:

(a) That bonds of the said Town of Pinetops be issued and sold, to provide funds to buy, build and erect a transmission line from Pinetops, N. C., to Tarboro, N. C., or other point, to enable said Town of Pinetops to buy and transmit such necessary electricity for lighting and power purposes as it may deem necessary from said Town of Tarboro, or other corporation; and to build the necessary lines and stations to distribute such electricity within the said Town of Pinetops, said bonds to be issued and sold under and pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act.

(b) That the maximum aggregate principal amount of said bonds shall not exceed the sum of Twenty Five Thousand Dollars.

(c) That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds, shall be annually levied and collected as said bonds severally become due and payable.

(d) That a statement of the debt of the municipality has been filed with the clerk, pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act, and is open to public inspection.

(e) The average assessed valuation of property subject to taxation by the municipality for the three fiscal years in which taxes were last levied, is \$251,030.33.

And further notice is hereby given do hereby provide and enact that this ordinance shall take effect, and be in full force when approved by the voters of this municipality as said election."

(f) The amount of the net debt of the municipality outstanding and authorized is, None; to be authorized under the provisions of this ordinance, not to exceed \$25,000.00.

(g) The Board of Commissioners deeming it advisable to obtain the assent of the voters of the municipality, and having called a special election to pass upon this question, that the regular registration books will be opened from the 23rd day of October, 1920, to the 13th day of November, 1920, inclusive, at the regular polling place, and for the purpose of this election, Harry Fagan is hereby appointed Registrar, and Frank Walston and Joe Moore Judges of the election.
