Dr. W. W. Green was called to Scotland Neck yesterday on professional business.

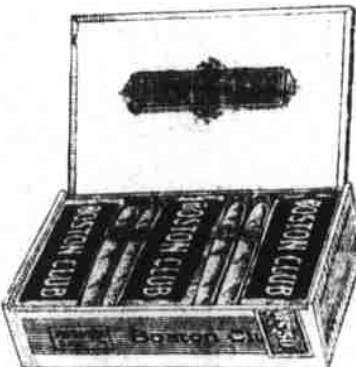
