BILL TO ABOLISH PRIVATE OWNERSHIP IN LAND

LONDON, May 2.—A bill to abolish private property in land and to transfer all lands in Great Britain which is not already the property of the crown or of any public authority to a newly created Ministry of Lands has been introduced into the House of Commons.

In the case of agricultural land, while all the buildings (except laborers cottages) and other permanent improvements would be transferred to the new ministry, the measure provides arrangements where they can become the property of the tenant and form part of the tenant right, together with all other im-

Compensation to owners is to be paid in the form of five percent National Land Stock (providing an annual income equal to the present net letting value of the land transferred) redeemable at par after thirty years.

After the redemption of the stock one-fourth of the net revenue of the land will be applicable to national purposes and three-fourths to local purposes.
