EASTERN CAROLINA CHAMBER OF COM.

The progress that is being made in the organization of the Eastern Carolina Chamber of Commerce is simply wonderful, according to the statement given out this morning from the vice president and manager, N. G. Barriett, whose headquarters are temporarily at Greenville.

"There seems to be the very best kind of feeling among the business men for an organization of this kind," Mr. Barriett said today, when questioned by a reporter of this paper. It was further shown that the interest being manifested is due to the fact that business men of Eastern North Carolina are waking up to the realization of the fact that something must be done, and done pretty quickly, to meet the conditions that are facing Eastern North Carolina.

It is the purpose of this organization, to co-ordinate the forces of the 39 counties in Eastern North Carolina, and focus this tremendous force along the lines of constructive development for this section. In addition to developing the district agriculturally, it is being planned to put on a nation-wide advertising campaign, to attract the attention of this nation to Eastern North Carolina, where everything is conducive to happiness and prosperity, when the resources are properly developed.

Diversification of crops is the main plank in the program of the Eastern Carolina Chamber of Commerce and these are the things that needs more stressing, during the next few years than this one thing: "Live at Home" campaign. An examination into the records of this territory will reveal the astonishing fact that in most of the counties, more money is being sent out of the county for food and feedstuffs than all the crops of the county amount to. This thing can be remedied, and will be remedied if the program of the Eastern Chamber of Commerce is put on and carried through in Eastern North Carolina.
