COLLIE CLEARED OF DISHONESTY ACTS

WASHINGTON, July 20.—The state department announced today that charges against D. C. Collie, the commissioner general of the United States to the Brazilian Centennial Exposition, had disclosed "no basis for any charge of dishonesty or moral turpitude." Collie has been directed to return to Rio Janeiro to take over American participation in the exposition.

BERLIN THEATRES HOLD RECORD ON SHAKESPEARE

BERLIN, July 20.—Shakespeare is being performed oftener in Germany than in his native country, according to statistics issued by the German Shakespeare Society. In 1921 there were 1,997 performances of Shakespeare plays in Germany against 372 in England. "Midsummer Night's Dream," which is the favorite with the Germans, was given 118 times on 33 different stages.

LONDON CHORUS GIRL WINS SUIT IN COURT

LONDON, July 20.—Here is one for American theatrical producers of girly girl shows: Miss Doris Thomas was awarded \$500 damages in a London court for having been dismissed from a touring "Argar" company. The manager who dismissed Miss Thomas attempted to show that she had been dismissed for wearing too few clothes during her performance. He didn't succeed.

USES 41 RADIOPHONES.

WASHINGTON, July 20.—Forty-one radiophone stations are used by the department of agriculture in the transmission to farmers of weather crops and market news, according to department officials here. This service has expanded rapidly since it was inaugurated 18 months ago, the four latest additions to the department's list of stations being at Memphis, Jacksonville, Roswell, New Mexico, and Milwaukee.
