(By The Associated Press) Petrograd, Oct. 6 .- American eorated milk is finding an enorus sale in Russia. Nearly much milk in tins including brands never retailed in the United States, is shown in the shop windows of Petnigrad and Moscow as can be found implayed in American cities. Many of them brands apparently are put

up exclusively for the export trade The price here for a one-third pound tin is from 20 to 30 cents. American milk may be bought at the railway stations, in the villages, and at the great markets ionteh in and at the great markets in the cities. In many instances it is peddled by children.
