Public notice is hereby given that by virtue of a decree of sale signed by Hon. F. A. Daniels in a certain cause pending in the Superior Court of the above county entitled "W. H. Horne et al administrators etc., of W. P. Mercer vs. Mary S. Mercer et al" the undersigned commissioners will offer for sale at public auction on the highest bidder the lands hereinafter described upon the terms herein stated, to wit:
The sale will be held on the premises in No. 13 township above county and state, on Thursday, December 28, 1922, commencing at 10:00 o'clock a. m., and continuing until said sale is completed.
The terms of sale will be one-third cash, balance in 1 and 2 years, deferred payments to bear 6 per cent interest from date of confirmation, the 1-3 cash will be payable 10 per cent of the purchase price on date of sale and balance upon confirmation by the court.
The property will be sold clear of liens, the purchasers to receive fee simple title; taxes accrued including year 1922 to be paid by the commissioners out of the proceeds of sale.
All sales will be subject to confirmation by the Judge of the Superior court holding the courts in the second judicial district.
