ROCKINGHAM—Manly's majority will be about 190; Lillington Senator, Caldwell and Ford, Commoners, all whigs; a gain for Manly of about 60.

BURKE AND McDOWELL. Manly 1348; Reid 346; Walton, Whig 967; Avery, Democrat 911; Whitson, Whig 811.
