THE HUGE EXPRESS GRAFT
The Interstate Commerce commission's report on the express monopoly sets forth that while the express companies are paying dividends on a capitalization of \$106,000,000, their actual investment is only \$7,000,000. This report also shows that the express companies are all owned by the railroads on whose lines they operate, so by maintaining the express companies, the railroads simply collect a higher price for carrying certain classes of freight than they could collect were they required to conduct the express business themselves.

The express graft is one of the main reasons for the high cost of food, as much food stuff, especially the green variety, is carried by that method.
