ORDER

It appearing to the court that the defendants, S. G. Seligman, and Harry Ball are non-residents of the State of North Carolina and cannot after due diligence be found in the State, that the plaintiff has a good and meritorious cause of action against the defendants as appears by the complaint in this cause; and that the defendants have property in this State over which this Court has jurisdiction, it is ordered by the court that publication be made in the Advance, a newspaper published in Pasquotank County, N.
