MAY MOVE HEADQUARTERS

There is a probability that the headquarters of the Coast Guards, which throughout the term of Supt. P. H. Morgan, was located at Shawboro, will be changed to Elizabeth City with the incoming of the new Superintendent Mr. Edgar Chadwick. PERQUIMANS CUTS BIG TREE

Perquimans County gave to commerce a few days ago the biggest tree cut in Eastern North Carolina in many years if not the largest cut on record. This tree was a gigantic pine, measuring 92 feet from the stump to the first limb. The lumber from it measured 7,433 feet. It was cut by the Major Doyle and Hudson Lumber Company and carried from the woods near Hertford by special

appliances constructed for this purpose and occasion.
