"HEART OF THE BLUE RIDGE"

One who picks up the book which Waldron Baily has written and given this title the idea that here is another of the typical love stories of the southern mountains has in store a pleasant surprise. The opening chapter indeed promises little out of the ordi nary and the style of the new author is not at its best at the begining where he gives one the impression that he learned the mountain dialect out of a book instead of by actual contact with the people of the hills.

hero gets into action the read ers interest is keenly awak n ed and is held closely to the closing chapter. Probably a story that will prove popular generally, the book has more than usual interest to the North Carolnian and especially to those who are familiar with the geography and history of this part of the state. the story takes the mountain from the home where he grown into manthoood without ever having traveled on a railroad or seen any more of world than stretched before his eyes from the top of his native mountains to Norfolk. From there he jour nevs on a canal beat through Dismal Swamp Canal to Eliz abeth City, is shipwreaked on Pamlico Sound, and reaches New York, his final destination on the private yacht of a mil lionaire. Summoned home again by a telegram telling him that his sweetheart is in grave danger, he flies back to North Wilkesboro on a special train and reaches his sweet heart's home in the first auto mobile to penetrate the moun tain fastnesses.

The book abounds in local color and if the story teller's descriptions of the hill country are as geographically accurate as are his pictures of this cor ner of the state, no doubt the North Wilkesboro reader of the story would be able to locate the hero's cabin home.

In "Cyclone" Brant and his plogs the Elizabeth City reader will recognize the far-famed 'Rurricane' Branch who for long years with his famous breed of bloodhounds was called to all parts of the state to track to earth the criminals who had succeeded in cluding justices. Many readers too, will recog nize the captain of the boat on which 'Zeke' tound work and later met shipwreck.


